#### About this record

This file consists of a single letter, dated 25 February 1939, from Hugh Weightman, Political Agent at Bahrain, to the Political Resident in the Persian Gulf, Bushire.

The letter relays a message received from the Residency Agent at Sharjah, reporting the death of Shaikh Muhammad bin Sultan an-Nu'aimi of Dhank [Shaikh Muḥammad bin Sultan Āl Nu'aymī of Ḍank] on 28 January 1939. The letter also reports a rumour that Shaikh Muhammad was poisoned by his brother.

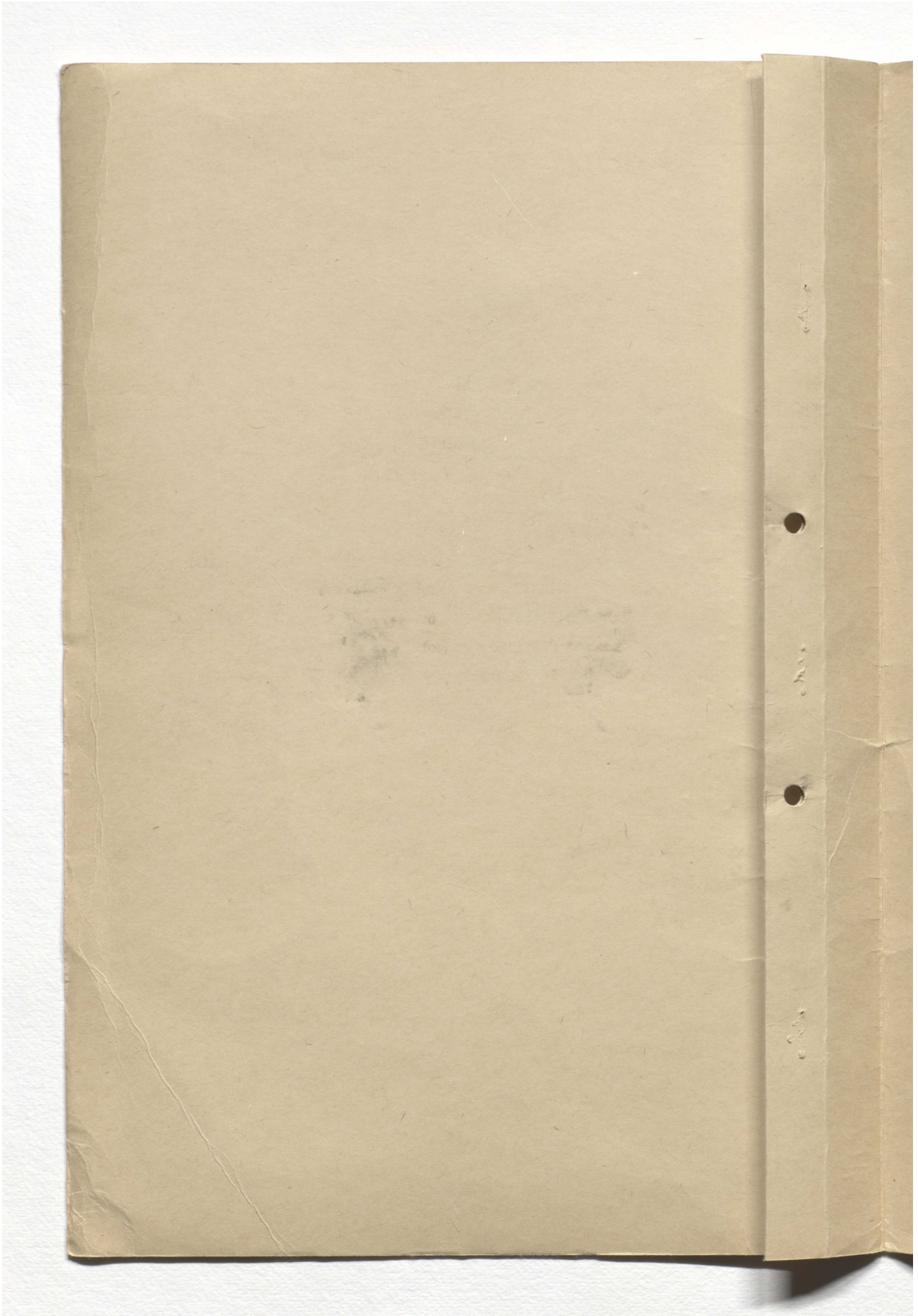

Memorandum

The Residency Agent, Sharjah, reports that Shaikh Muhammad bin Sultan an-Nu'aimi of Dhank died on the 28th January 1939. Shaikh Saqr bin Sultan of Baraimi now holds the combined Shaikhsip of both Dhank and Baraimi.

2. There is a rumour, and some reasons for believing, that Shaikh Muhammad was poisoned by his brother; but there is no confirmation of this.

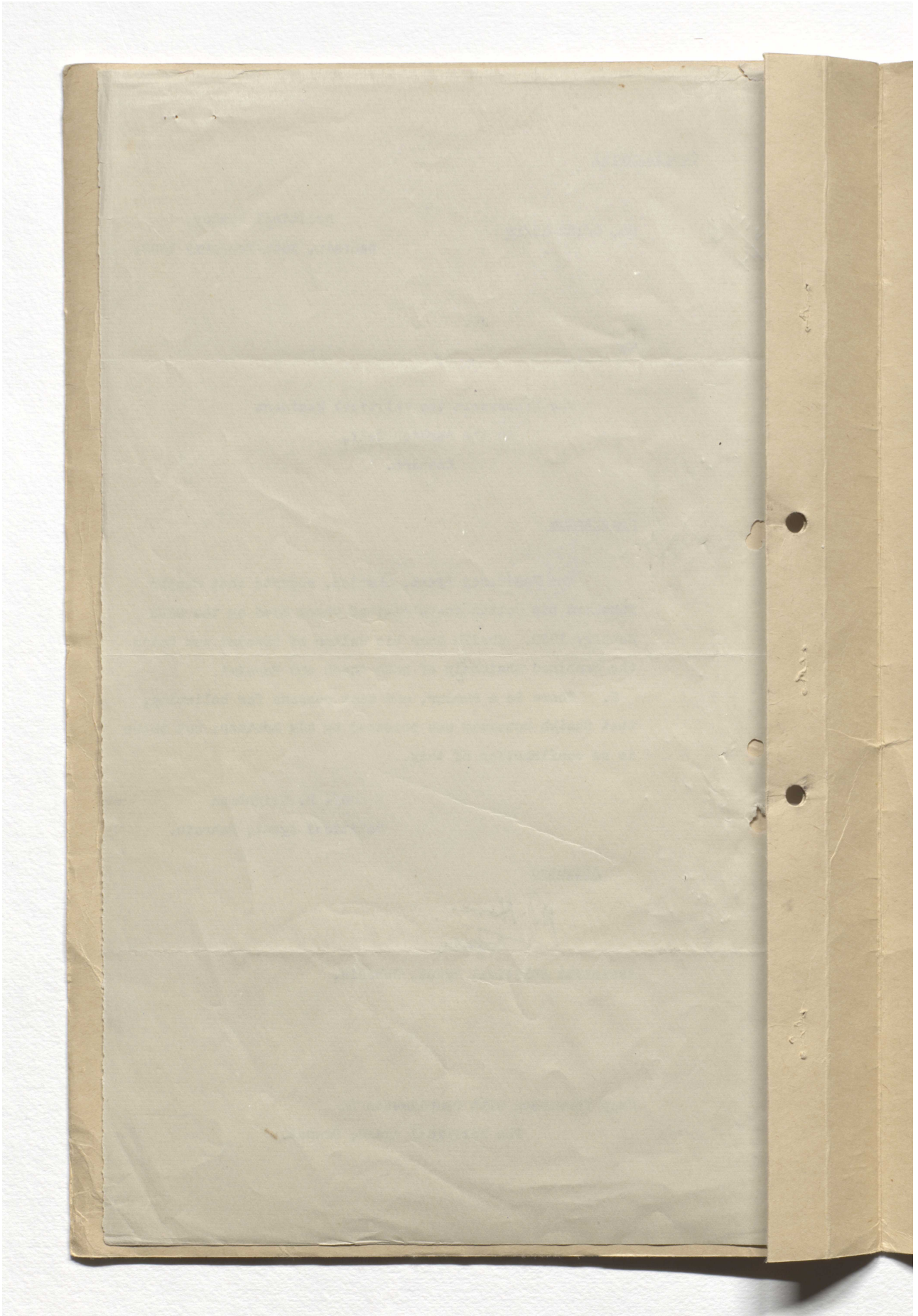
