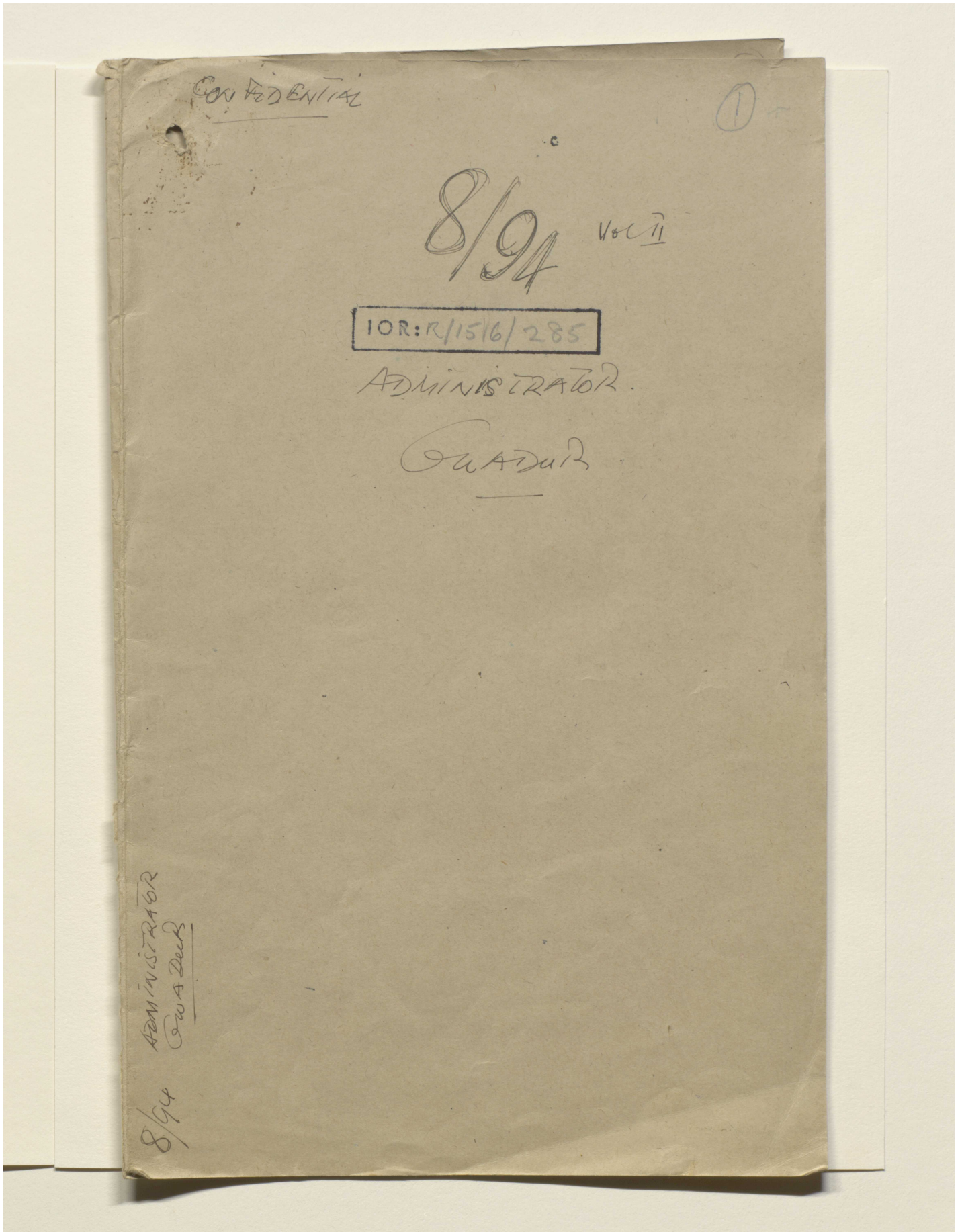

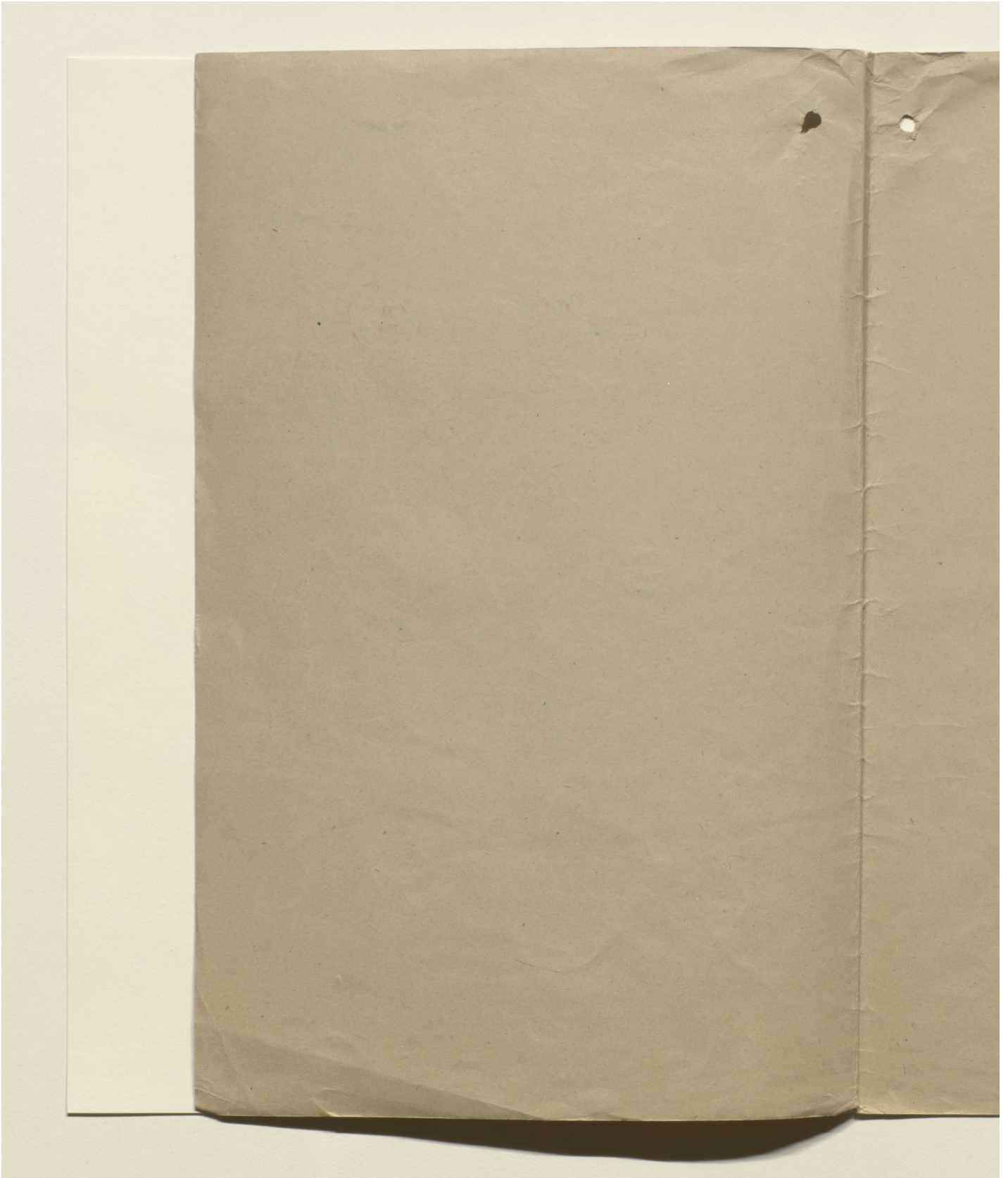


About this record

Continuing on from the previous file (IOR/R/15/6/284), this file concerns the position of Administrator, Gwadar [Gwadar]. The file documents the end of the current occupant's term as Administrator, and the recruitment of his successor. Following the selection of a British official for the post, the correspondence discusses arrangements for the outgoing postholder, Abdur Rahman Qureshi, on deputation in Muscat since 1946, to hand over to his successor in May 1949 before returning to the Baluchistan Administration, Pakistan.

Notable correspondents include the following: the Political Agent and Consul, Muscat; the Political Resident in the Persian Gulf; Abdur Rahman, Administrator, Gwadar; the Sultan of Muscat and Oman [Sa'īd bin Taymūr Āl Bū Sa'īd]; the Sultanate of Muscat and Oman's Minister for Foreign Affairs.

I have the honour to invite a reference to my letter No. 189 dated the 27th, September 1948, in which I requested that arrangement may kindly be made to relieve me at an early date.
