### حول هذا السجل

هذا المجلد عبارة عن مفكرة مجلدة مع ملاحظات مكتوبة بخط يد جورج ناثانيال كرزون بالقلم الرصاص. وتعلق الملاحظات، التي تعد استمراراً لمفكرة سابقة، Mss Eur F112/365، برحلات كرزون عبر بلاد فارس في الفترة ١٨٩٠-١٨٨٩. تغطي الملاحظات الفترة من ٢٥ نوفمبر ١٨٨٩ إلى ٢٠ يناير ١٨٩٠، وتعلق بصورة خاصة بزيارات كرزون لطهران وأصفهان. تأتي الملاحظات في معظم أجزاء المفكرة على شكل يوميات يسبقها عناوين بالتاريخ. أغلب الأوراق تحتوي على خط عمودي مرسوم في أسفل الوسط بالقلم الرصاص أو بالحبر؛ لا تمثل هذه الخطوط تقسيم الأوراق بأعمدة، حيث أن الملاحظات مكتوبة على الخطوط، وليس ضمن أعمدة.


Dear Mr. & Mrs. C. J. Smith,
