A letter from Brigadier-General John Malcolm to Neil Benjamin Edmonstone, Private Secretary to the Governor-General of Bengal, sent from Madras [Chennai] and dated 3 October 1809. The letter forwards a dispatch from Captain Grant, who has completed a mission under Malcolm's orders in Mekran [Makrān], and commends Grant to the Governor-General.

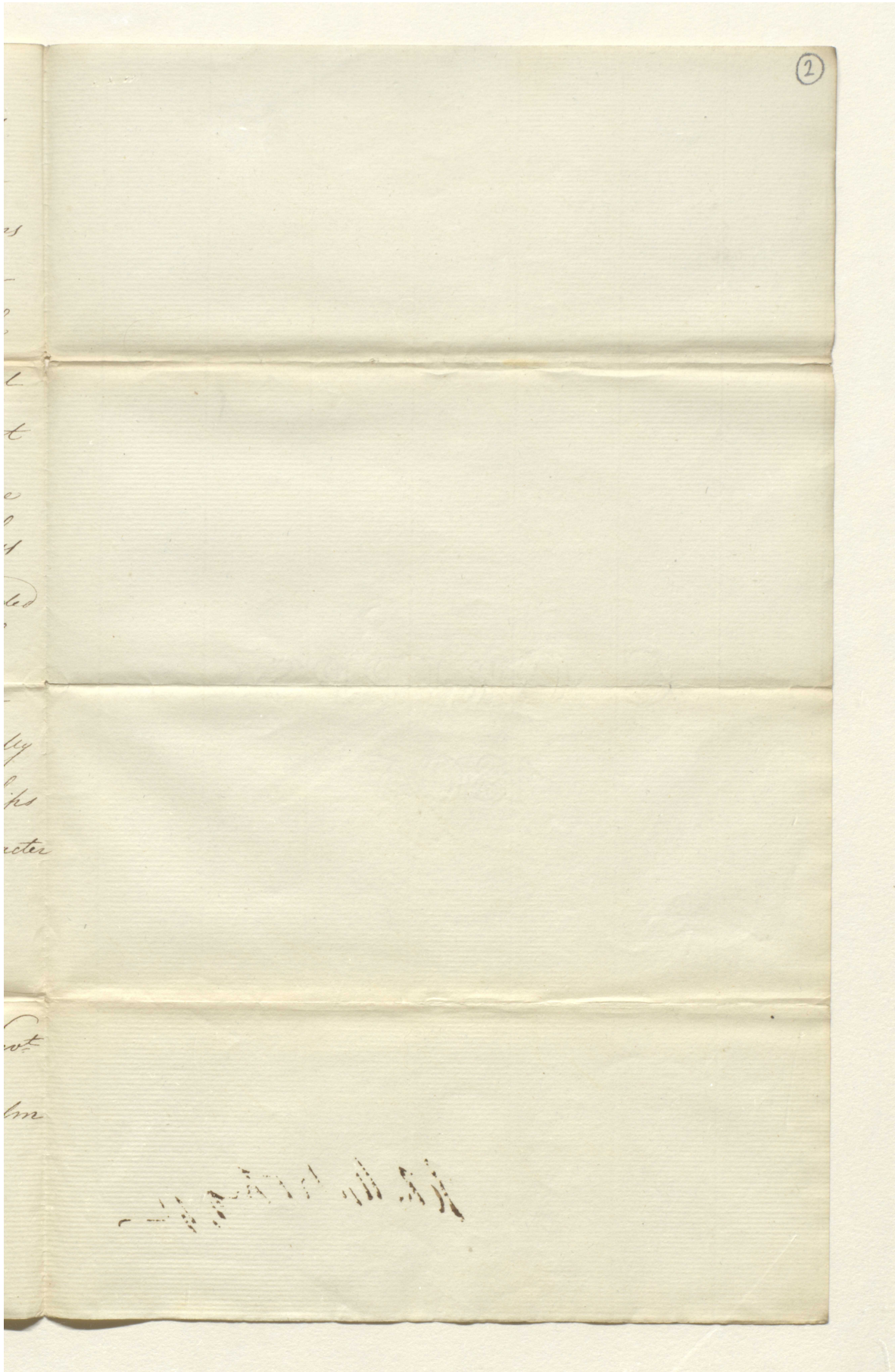
