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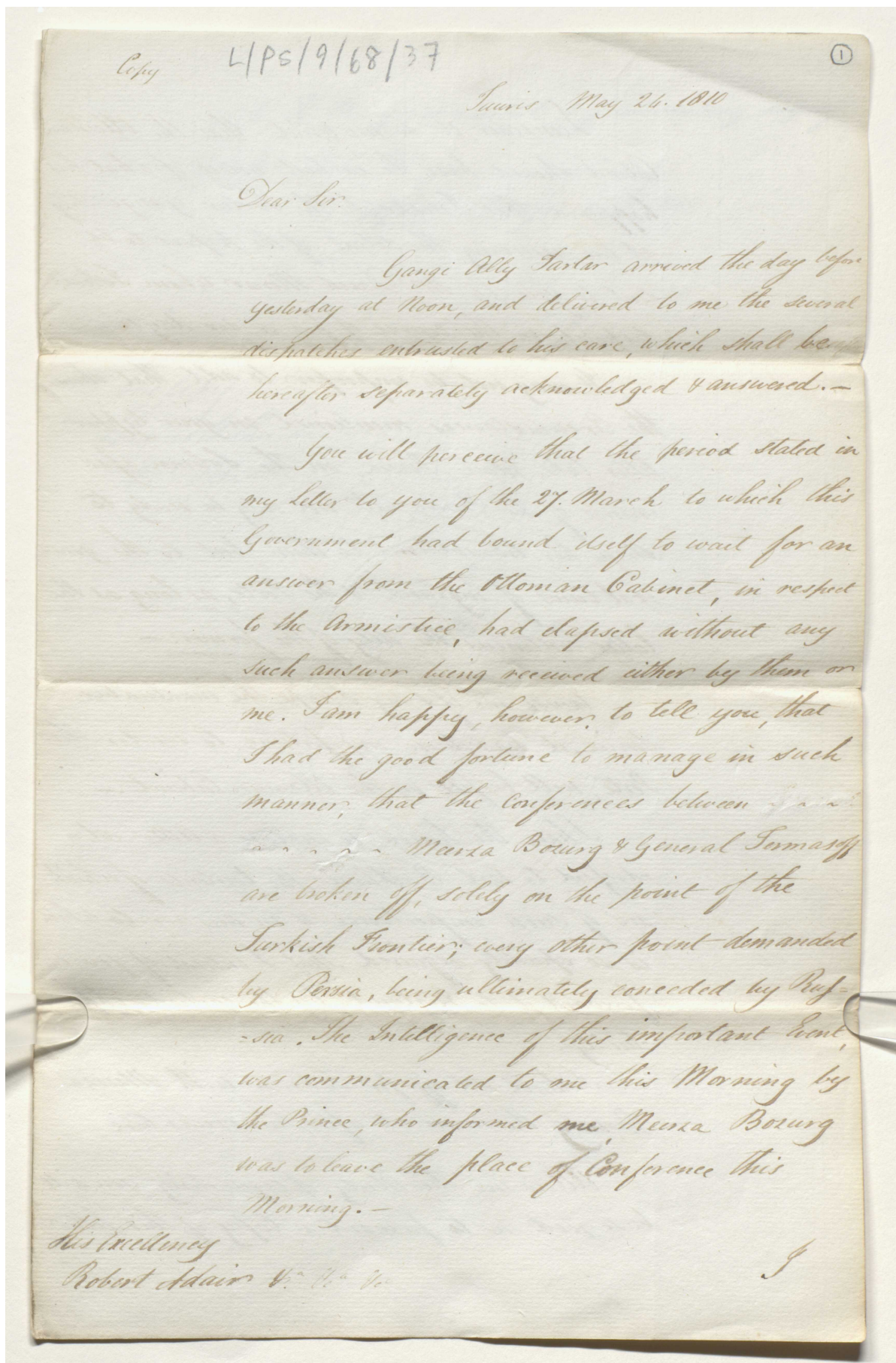


### **About this record**

Copy of a letter from HM Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Persia [Iran] Sir Harford Jones, to HM Ambassador to the Ottoman Empire, Sir Robert Adair, dated 26 May 1810. The letter concerns the breaking off of armistice negotiations between Persia and Russia over the issue of the security of the Turkish [Ottoman] frontier, and details the Persian willingness to cooperate with England [Britain] and the Ottoman Empire on the condition that England and the Ottomans remain allies. Jones also states that he is enclosing an urgent letter [not included in this item] to Earl Bathurst.

The letter was enclosed in Jones's secret letter of 2 June 1810, which was received on 4 October 1810.

I consider it so material that the Ottoman Cabinet should have the earliest notice of what has happened, that I dispatch the Tartar, Gargi Ally ad hoc, reserving the detail of the papers to be sent to you by Mr. David Morier, whom I shall dispatch in the course of five or six days. -

It may not be improper to add that should the Circumstances mentioned in your Cypher letter take place, Persia, on the solemn assurance of the Prince, will not only be ready to shape her transactions to them, but to the general views of England & the Porte, as long as the latter continues the Ally of the former. -

Excuse me if I say I hope the invaluable service, it has been my fortune to render the Porte, will be felt by the Ottoman Cabinet. -

I have the honor to enclose a letter addressed to Earl Bathurst, the Contents of which are of such importance, & an answer to which is so speedily required, that I intreat of you to forward it to England by the earliest opportunity.

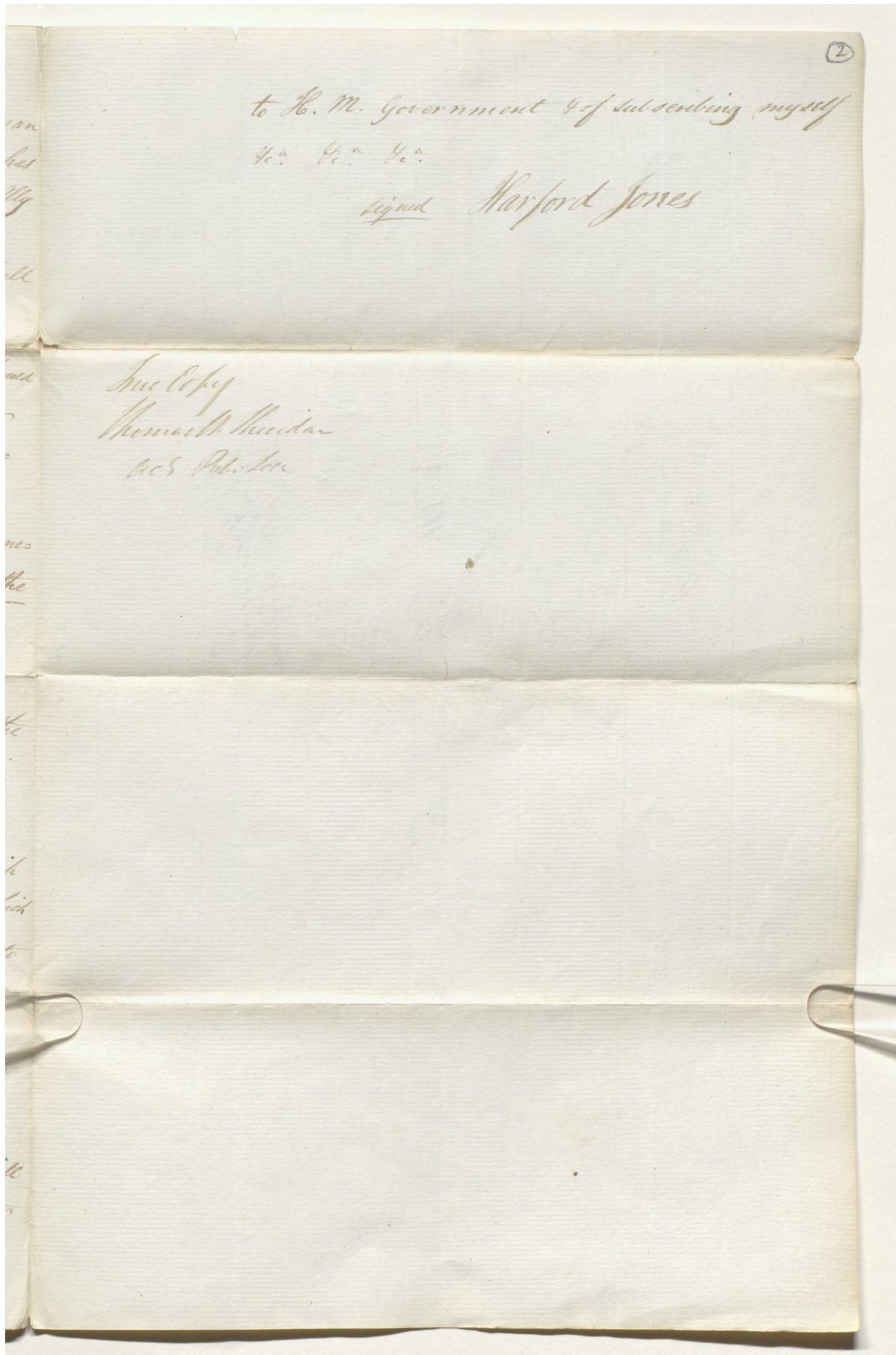
