Copy of a letter from HM Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to Persia [Iran], Sir Gore Ouseley, to the Secret Committee of the East India Company. The letter announces Ouseley's arrival at Bombay [Mumbai], and gives an account of his journey and the news he has received from Persia prior to beginning his journey from Bombay to Tehran.

The letter was sent in January 1811 and received on 1 July 1811.

Duncan, whose universal character for the bound - est sense , as well as the most amiable urbanity of man = = ners, must be so well known to your Hon the Committee as to render my Tribute of Just praise unnece pary - I cannot however, repress the expression of my personal gratiful feelings towards M. Duncan, in declaring that I have profited very considerably by his luminous and liberal communications on Jubjects of the most interesting nature as connected with the affairs of the Hon ble last India Company and the Embaloy entrusted to my management and that I feel exceedingly obliged by the kind and hospitable manner in which he has been pleased to receive me received The Honble She Secret Committee of Amber Jourt of Directors East India Amere



Treceived letters from the Persian Ministers and Six Harford Jones on my arrival here - my progress to Jehran is anxiously looked for, if any credit is to be placed in the professions of the former - but I Shall Soon have an opportunity of ascertaining the Truth or false: = hood of them, as I Shall proceed to Busheher on the 24th or 25th of this month. The news, on the whole, from Persia, is not of the most promising nature - The Aufsians have given the Prince Proyal's Troops Several partial defeats - a Grench mission for Persia, is positively arrived in Con= = stantinople with askar Khan, and the Supposed Turkish Amba bador, who was expected at Tabriz in February last proves to be a Kapigi Bashi, Sent to Dispose the Pasha of Baghdad - The Persian Soldiers, too, Jam Sorry To find, do not make that improvement and progression European tactics and mode of war fare that was expected. I write these few lines by the overland dispatch now about to Set off- and Trust that my next letter to your Honorable Committee may communicate more agreeable intelligence - Dexpect to be at Jehran before the 1st of May-I shall not enclose in this, a copy of my letter to Lord Minto of the 19" ult: from Point de Galle, but shall have the honor of Sending one in the duplicate of this letter by the Exetar last. Indiaman . Thave the honor to remain , with the highest respect and consideration , Honorable Sirs, your most øbedient humble Servant Jore Duseley




