About this record

A copy of a letter from Francis Warden, Chief Secretary of the Government of Bombay [Mumbai], to William Bruce, Resident in Bushire [Būshehr], sent from Bombay Castle and dated 1 March 1822.

The letter authorises the payment of an indemnity to residents of Charrack [Bandar-e Chārak] and Lingua [Bandar-e Lengeh] for ships destroyed by British forces.

The letter was enclosed in the letter of Major George Willock, Acting Chargé d'Affaires in Persia [Iran], to the Secret Committee of the Court of Directors of the East India Company dated 27 August 1822 (IOR/L/PS/9/69/117).

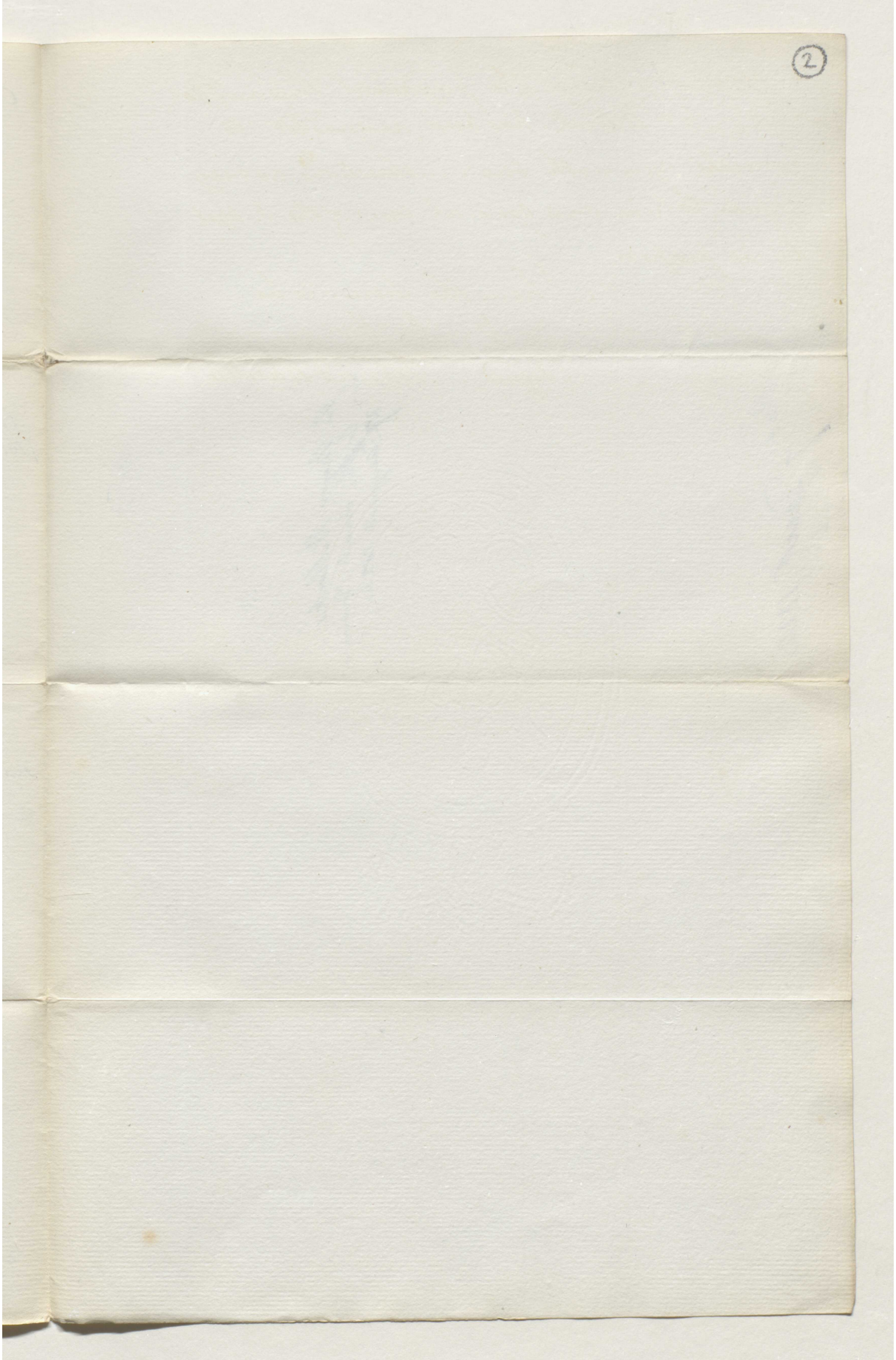
