#### About this record

A copy of a letter from Dr John Cormick, Chief Physician to the Crown Prince of Persia [Iran], to Henry Willock, HM Charge d'Affaires in Persia, sent from Tabreez [Tabrīz] and dated 23 October 1824.

Cormick reports that he read Willock's message to the Prince ['Abbās Mīrzā] concerning the proposed transfer to India of responsibility for diplomatic relations between Britain and Persia (IOR/L/PS/9/69/227). The Prince affirms his support and advises on how to advance the proposal at the Persian Court.

The letter was enclosed in Willock's letter to the Secret Committee of the Court of Directors of the East India Company dated 16 November 1824 (IOR/L/PS/9/69/238).
