#### About this record

Letter from the Moatimid a Dowluh, Abdul Wahab [Mīrzā ‘Abd al-Wahhāb Nishāṭ Iṣfahānī, Mu‘tamid al-Dawlah], to the East India Company Envoy to Persia [Iran], Lieutenant-Colonel John Macdonald Kinneir. The Moatimid a Dowluh reports that Mirza Abul Hussain Khan [Mīrzā Abū al-Ḥasan Khān Shīrāzī, Persian Minister for Foreign Affairs], who has been directed by the King of Persia [Fath-‘Alī Shāh Qājār, Shāh of Persia] to conclude peace in the war between Russia and Persia [Russo-Persian War, 1826-1828], has taken his leave and been ordered to proceed (see IOR/L/PS/9/71/179).

This document was originally enclosed, numbered 11 in dispatch No. 81, in Macdonald Kinneir’s letter to the Secret Committee of the East India Company of 21 January 1828 (IOR/L/PS/9/71/154).

Letter from the Moatimid a Dowluh

I have before written to you  
on the subject of Mirza Abdul  
Hafsin Khan's mission. At this  
time he has taken leave and been  
ordered to proceed. The wishes of  
the King regarding the conclusion  
of Peace are in the hands of that  
Minister, on his arrival he will  
fully explain the matter to you  
till which time it is unnecessary  
for me to write again. Always  
inform me of your health.

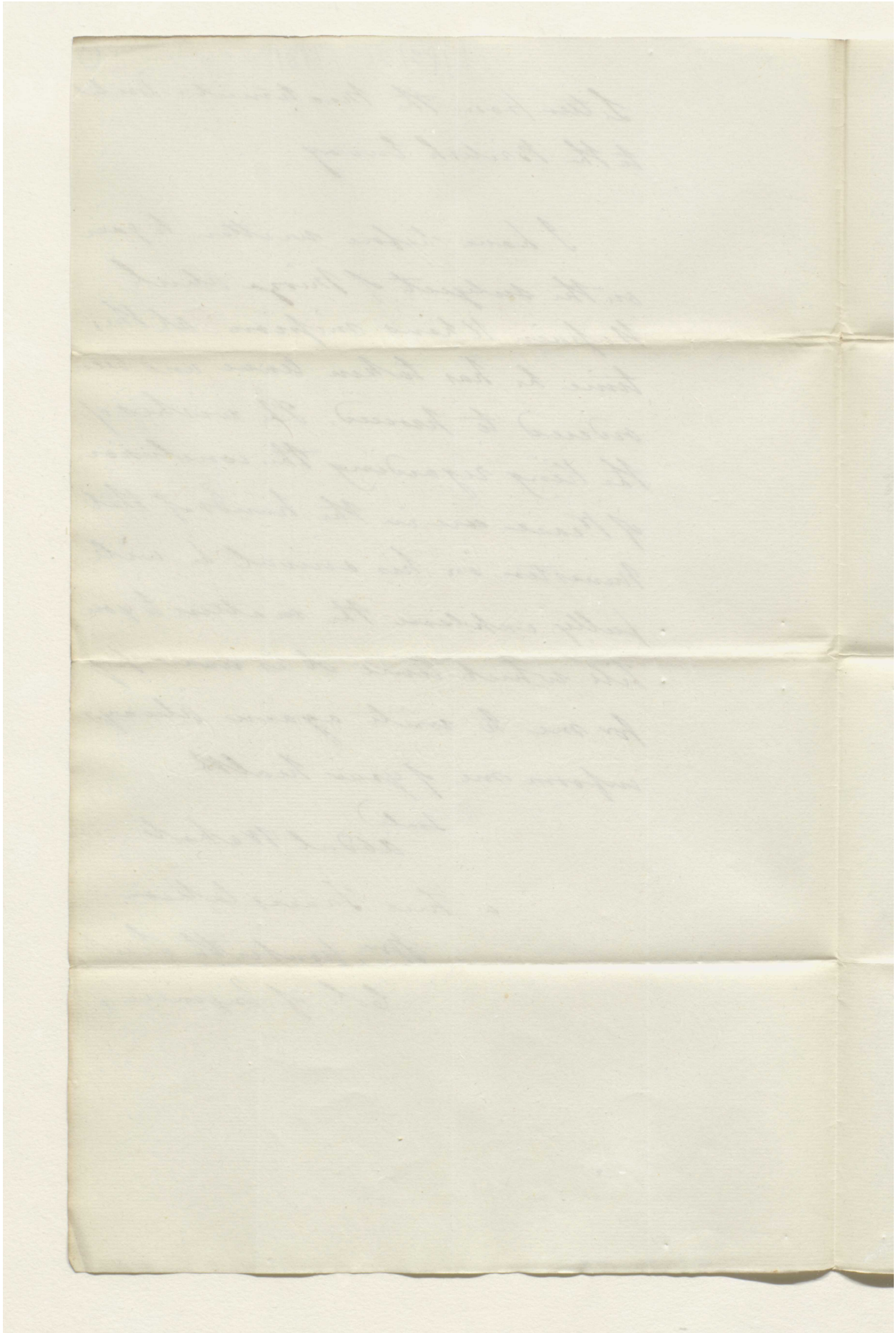

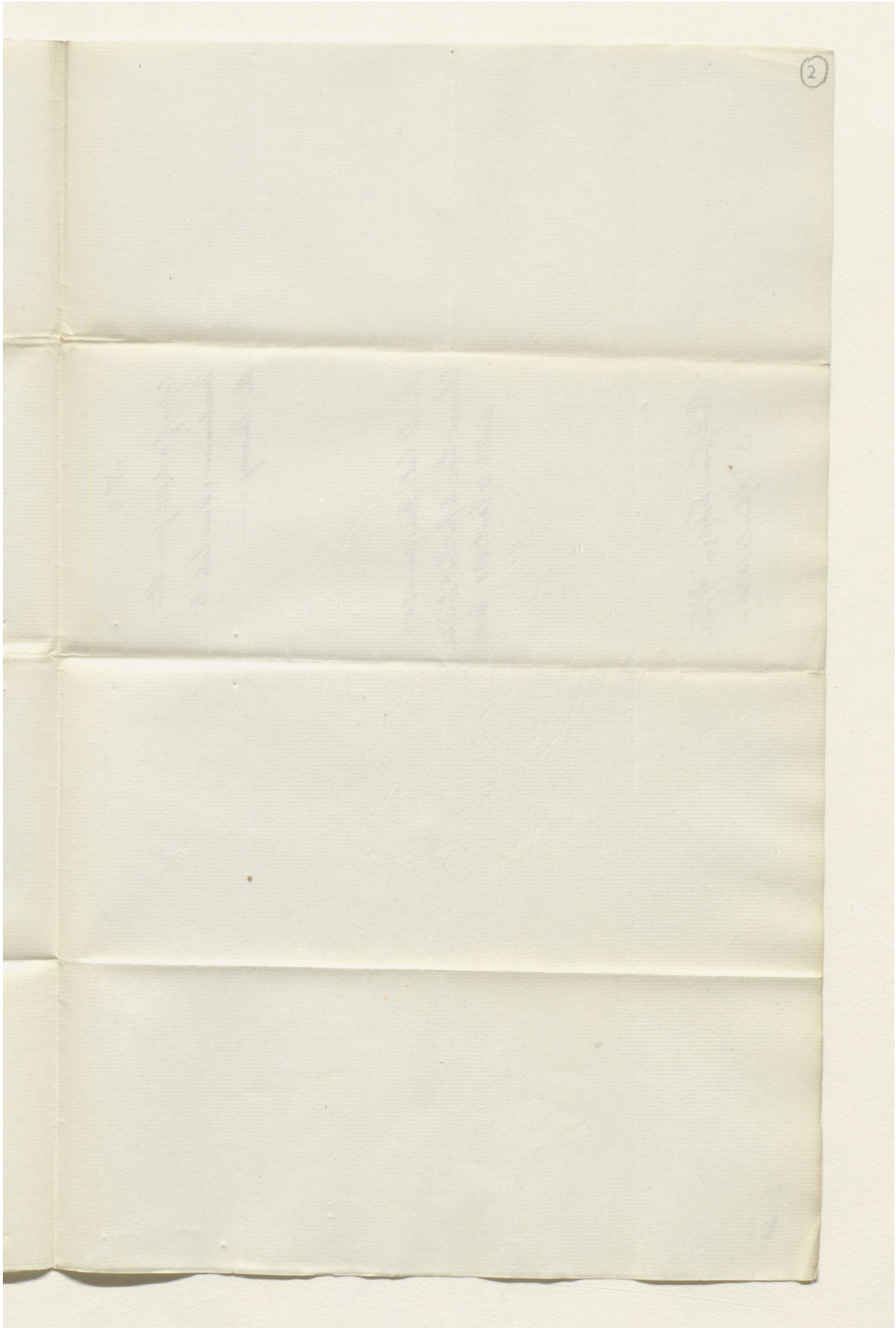
