#### About this record

Dispatch No. 17 from the East India Company Envoy to Persia [Iran], Lieutenant-Colonel John Macdonald Kinneir, to George Swinton, Chief Secretary to the Government of Bengal, dated 21 September 1826.

Macdonald Kinneir forwards a letter from his assistant Lieutenant John Campbell for the attention of the Governor-General (not enclosed) asking for an increased allowance.

This document was originally enclosed, numbered 1, in Macdonald Kinneir's dispatch No. 37 to the Secret Committee of the Court of Directors of the East India Company (IOR/L/PS/9/71/297).
