3<sup>d</sup> As directed in N<sup>o</sup> 2485 of 1843 in this Department I have also informed His Highness of the intention of Government to enforce payment of the Articles said to have been stolen from the Wreck of the Mary Mullaby; should it be found to be true the Articles were stolen by the Sheikhs of Bandar Abbas, and Wishes, or their people, and also of the breach of the XIV Article of the treaty of commerce by the Sheikhs, in refusing to assist the Vessel when in distress; and I have also intimated to His Highness the desire of Government that he should institute a strict enquiry into the conduct of the Sheikhs, and take measures to prevent a recurrence of such proceedings in his Dominions to which His Highness replied that the Sheikhs were afraid to assist lest they should be accused of robbery as Sheik Abdul Rahman of Wishes was, when on a former occasion he assisted an English vessel in distress, but that His Highness would institute the enquiry desired by Gov<sup>t</sup> and use his utmost endeavours to prevent a recurrence of such conduct. His Highness has written to the Sheikhs and His Highness has requested me to request that Gov<sup>t</sup> would appoint a native Agent, to reside either at Wishes or Bandar Abbas if Gov<sup>t</sup> would confer such a favor on His Highness. the truth is, the Emam fears the Sheik of Wishes; and his Authority over him is very slight indeed.



Captain Hemmell directed me to enquire of  
Haji Abdulla Alle Annal what he knew regarding  
the shipment on Board the Attalool Nakhimow, of  
Cash, goods, and a Chronometer from the house  
of Mhulfaa Moallums' sons. Agreeably to these or-  
ders I made enquiry of Haji Abdoolah Alle  
Annal on the subject, but he returned evasive  
answers. As the Attalool Nakhimow has lately ar-  
rived here, I have taken a certificate in a  
duplicate from her mate, who is an Englishman,  
of what he had learnt regarding Captain Fisher.  
I beg to enclose herein one of the certificates and  
I shall forward the other to the Resident in the Persian  
Gulf.

In my letter of the 1<sup>st</sup> Instant I informed you  
that a man had come to the Suruss family on  
the part of Shaiti Saif Bin Mubhaw. I now beg  
to inform you that on 2<sup>nd</sup> Instant another person by  
name Saad bin Ahmed came here from Shaiti  
Saif and informed the Suruss family that the  
Governor of Hermau having captured the forts  
of Pahlowjee and Dugem had marched towards  
Roodow accompanied by 3500 men and 3  
Cannons. Shaiti Saif is very apprehensive  
and has applied for succour to the Suruss family  
who (647)

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who however have been putting him off from day to day. The Inams family do not appear to be engaged in raising an Army.

On the 24<sup>th</sup> February last I learnt that a small slave had been sold to Mattha bin Fashim a Banian who lives in my neighbourhood. On this information I sent a man to enquire of Mattha whether the slave was really a native of Somal or not. Mattha replied that the slave was a small boy whom he & Mattha had received in satisfaction of a demand against his owner. Afterwards I took the boy from Mattha and told him that I would keep him & the boy for three days in order to make enquiries regarding him. At last when I found that the boy was really a native of Somal, I had him released. He now lives with me and I have purchased some clothes for him. I have written to the Resident on the subject and shall act according to his orders.

A certificate of what I have heard of M<sup>r</sup>. C. Fisher late Captain of the Brig "Mary Mullaly" of Mauritius.

Muscat 1<sup>st</sup> April 1844

M<sup>r</sup>. C. Fisher late Captain of the Brig "Mary Mullaly" at the time she being abandoned at Bandar Akhaz "Persian Gulf" arrived here on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1843 per Brig together with his wife and servant when and so soon he proceeded to the American Consul Syed bin Luffan where he

he was informed of my being here in Conam and of  
the ship "Alliatool Subinam" and ready to proceed to  
Calcutta" he immediately came on Board; myself  
and owners being on Board at the time, we con-  
-sulted conversation upon the Melancholy Si-  
-tuation in which he was placed &c. and there he  
desired to know the owners price and terms for  
his passage to Calcutta together with his wife  
and servant which I immediately inquired of the  
owner and then informed him when and so  
soon he went on shore and authorized Mr. Lyd-  
"Ben Culfaw" to settle for his passage, and who  
shortly after came on board and in a few minutes  
every thing being arranged.

Sunday 3<sup>d</sup> September about 10 A.M. I received  
a boat load of things from the Toppel in which  
Mr. Fisher had arrived in, and shortly after him  
- self wife and servant bringing with them two  
Boxes from where I do not know nor the contents  
but their appearance of length, breadth and weight  
I suppose them to contain money, Sextant and  
"Chronometer" the two latter being left at the American  
Consul's house during his time, says the "Persian"  
"Gulf" by what he Capt. Fisher informed after  
my departure from this Port during my Passage.

4<sup>th</sup> September Nautical time at 6 P.M. I received  
orders to weigh anchor and proceed to Calcutta;  
during my passage I had occasion to borrow his  
Sextant when and so soon I knew it to be the  
same and also Mr. Fisher showed me a box of  
Gold watches and guards which he Mr. Fisher  
(648) told

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told me that he left in the of eyed line balfan during his stay up the Persian Gulf and also a box of earrings both of which being of a considerable value and as he Mr. A Fisher told me then that he left the whole with eyed line balfan while he proceed to Bandar Abbas I had a little conversation with Mr. Fisher who was very delicate having been very ill suffering from the effects of the loss of the ship & the only thing I heard her say was that at the time the ship or vessel was going on shore he Mr. Fisher should say to his wife to hold fast, and not to say anything.

Servant

I also heard very bad accounts of the subject by the servant who was a Madagas but could speak a great deal of French I could not understand all that he said, he told me that they had a great deal of money on board at the time and that himself and Mr. Fisher took two cases up out of the after row and took all the money out and put in dirty linen and sent it in bags & & soon after the assistance came from the shore he Mr. Fisher should make the alarm about the money and collected all hands and told them that he had lost the cases of money.

The above is all that I can say concerning the parties and no more.
