About this record

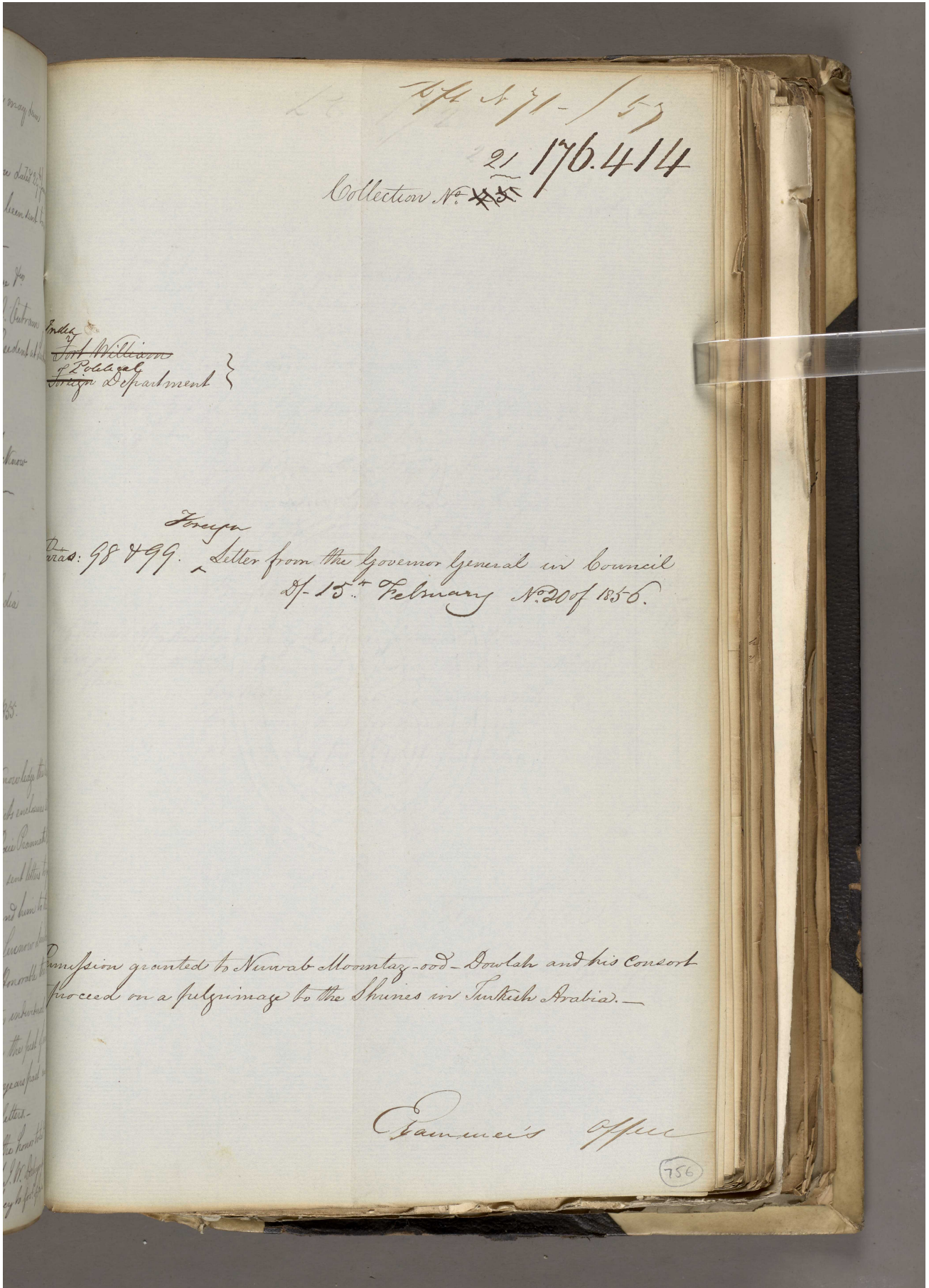
The item consists of copies and extracts of correspondence cited in, or enclosed with, a Foreign Letter from Fort William [Government of India] to the East India Company Court of Directors, dated 15 February 1856.

The item relates to two petitions addressed to the Governor-General of India from Nawab Moontazood Dowlah Hoosein Alee Khan Bahadoor [Nawwāb Ḥusayn ‘Alī Khañ Bahādur, Muntazid al-Dawlah] and Nawab Zeenutoonissa Begum [Nawwāb Zinat al-Nisā’ Begum], requesting permission to visit the shrines in Turkish Arabia [Ottoman Iraq] and to draw their pensions from the Bagdad [Baghdad] Political Agency. The petitions are forwarded to the Governor-General via Major-General J Outram, Resident at Lucknow, who also provides details of the pensions, who the petitioners are and why they are entitled to the pensions.

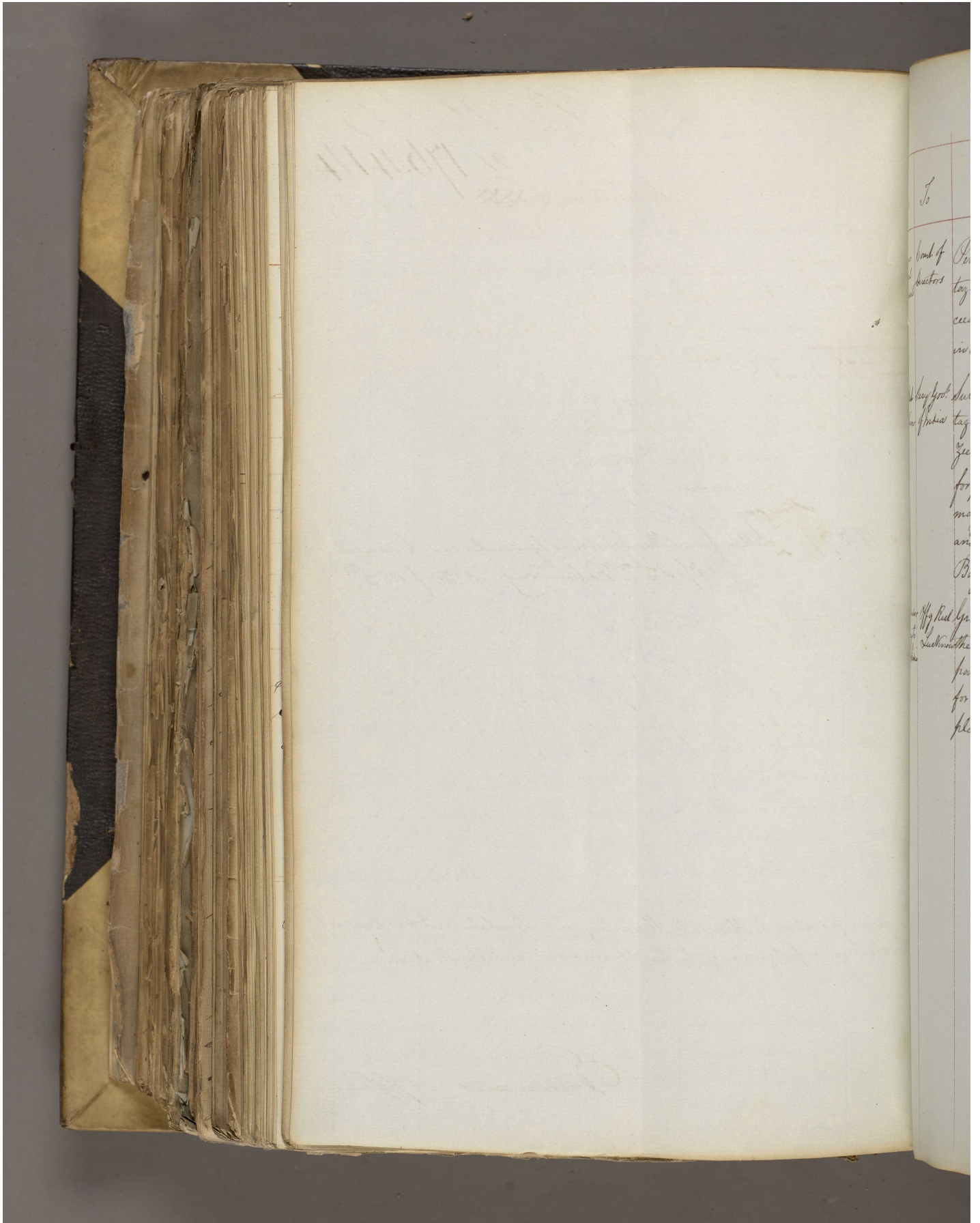
The item also contains the response from the Government of India to Outram.

The title page of the item contains the following references: 'India Political Department', Draft Number '71 [18]57', 'Collection No. 21', and 'Examiner's Office'. Originally, the Collection number was given as '45' but this has been crossed out and replaced with '21'. Similarly, the reference department was noted as 'Fort William Foreign' but this has been crossed out and replaced with 'India Political'.

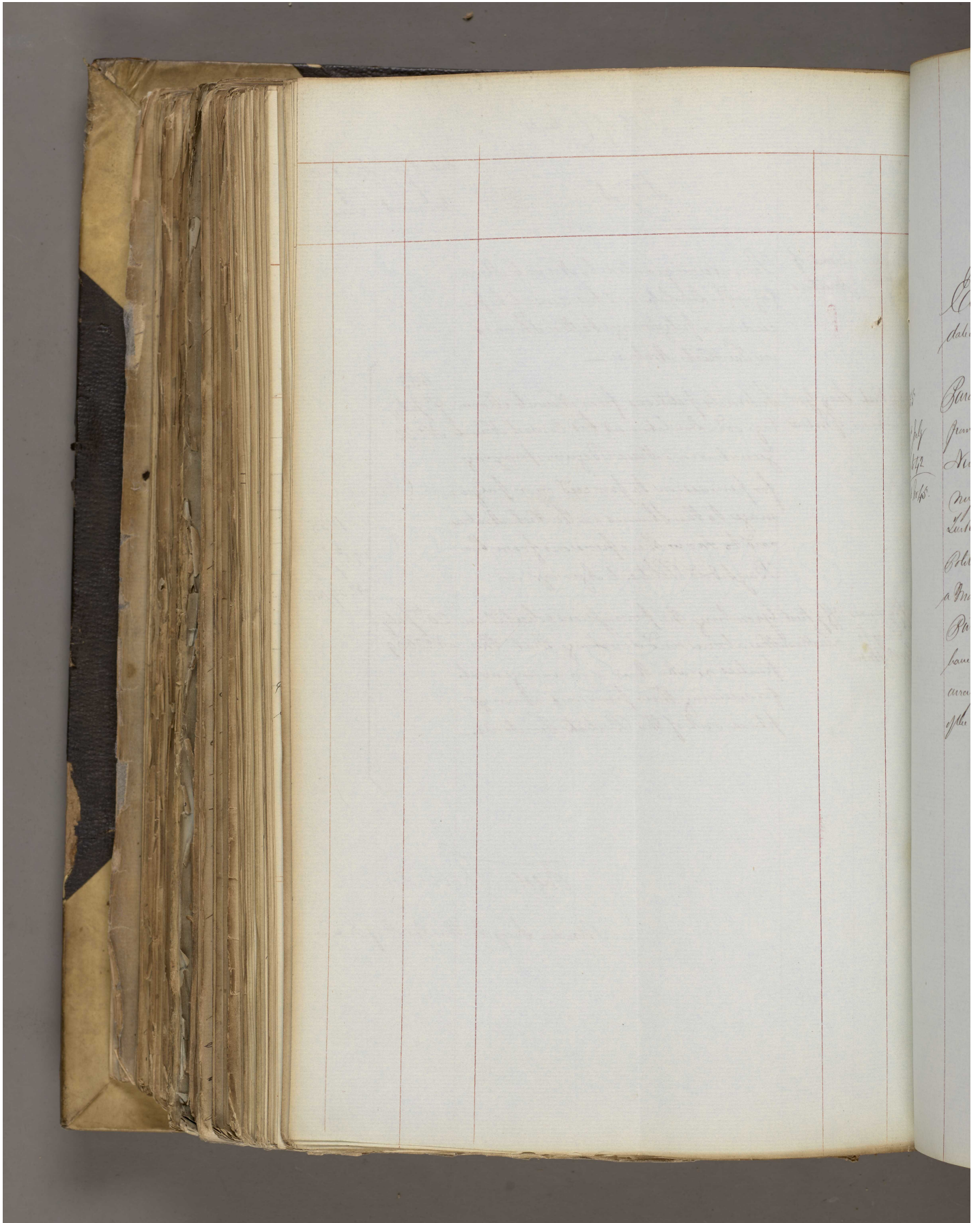

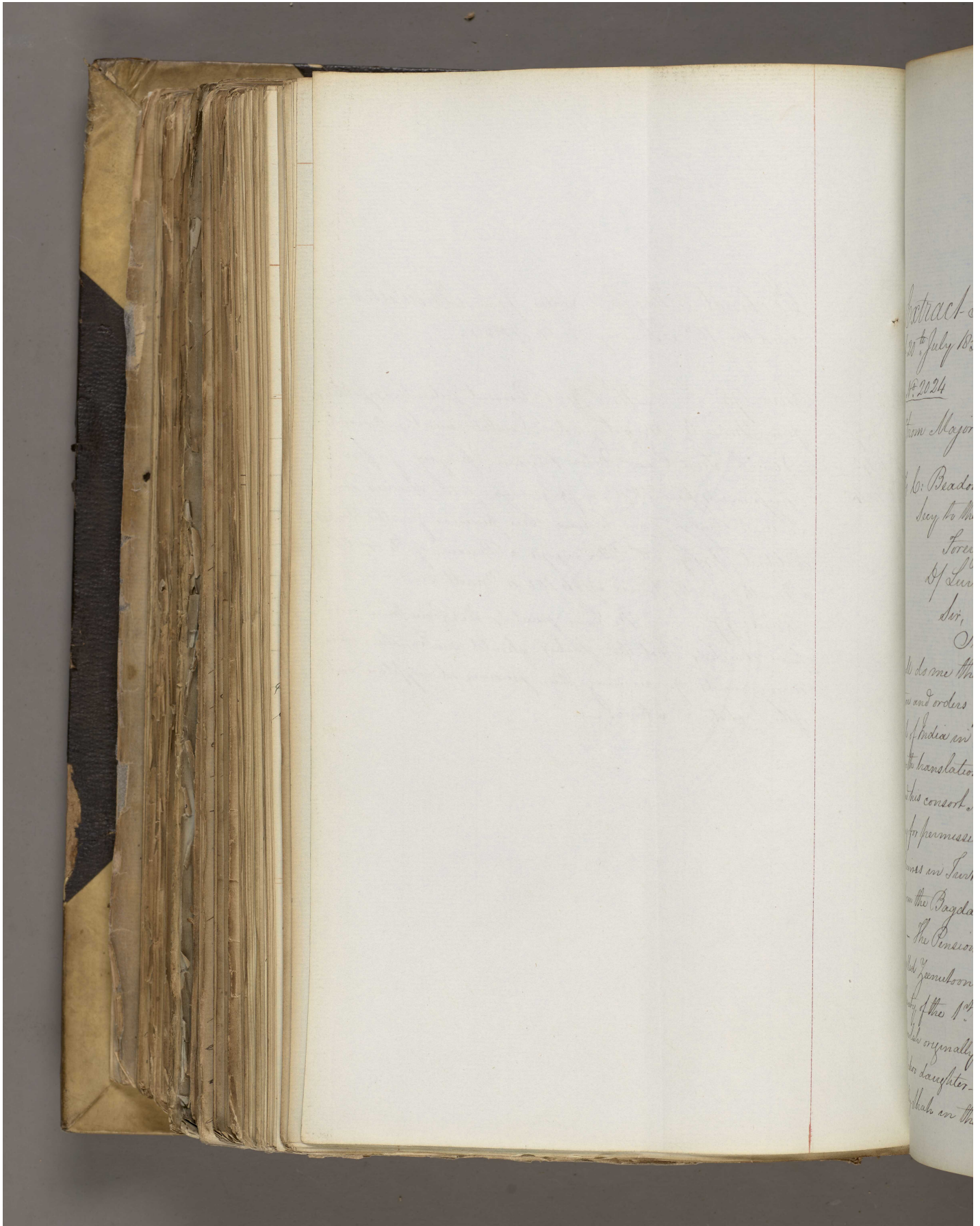

Para 98. The Offr. Resident submitted petitions from Nuwah Moomtaz-ood-Dowlah and his consort Nuwah Secant am Dupa Begum, praying for permission to proceed on pilgrimage to the shrines in Turkish Arabia, and to draw their pensions from the Royal Political Agency. The latter enjoys a Pension of Rs 4,000 a Month and the former of Rs 100 a Month.

Para: 99 We have granted the Permission and have decided that the parties should make their own arrangements for receiving their pensions at any place out of the British Territories.

of 20th July 1855. -

Sir,
I have the honor to request that you will do me the favor to submit for the consideration and orders of the Honble the President of the Council of India in Council the enclosed Persian petition with translations from Nawab Moomtaazood Dowlah and his consort Nawab Zeenutoonessa Begum praying for permission to proceed on pilgrimage to the Shrines in Turkish Arabia and to draw their pensions from the Bagdad Political Agency. -

2. - The Pension of Sultan Aulia Begum otherwise called Zeenutoonessa Begum was guaranteed in the Treaty of the 1st of March 1829 and that of Moomtaaz Dowlah originally enjoyed by his late mother Maszer Bahoo daughter-in-law of his late Majesty Mahomed Ally Shah in the deed of engagement of 22^d Nov^r 1838

3. — In the 6th Article of the former Deed it is stipulated that "should any of the pensioners above named reside in the Territory of the English Company the Resident at Lucknow shall remit to her ^{his or} her established pension," and in the 5th Article of the latter that "should any of the said pensioners or his or her heirs reside in the Territory of the British Government the Resident at Lucknow shall remit to him or her there his or her established pension."

4. — Sultan Aulia Begum enjoys a pension of Rs. 4000 a month and Moomtaazood Dowlah of Rs. 100 a month. —

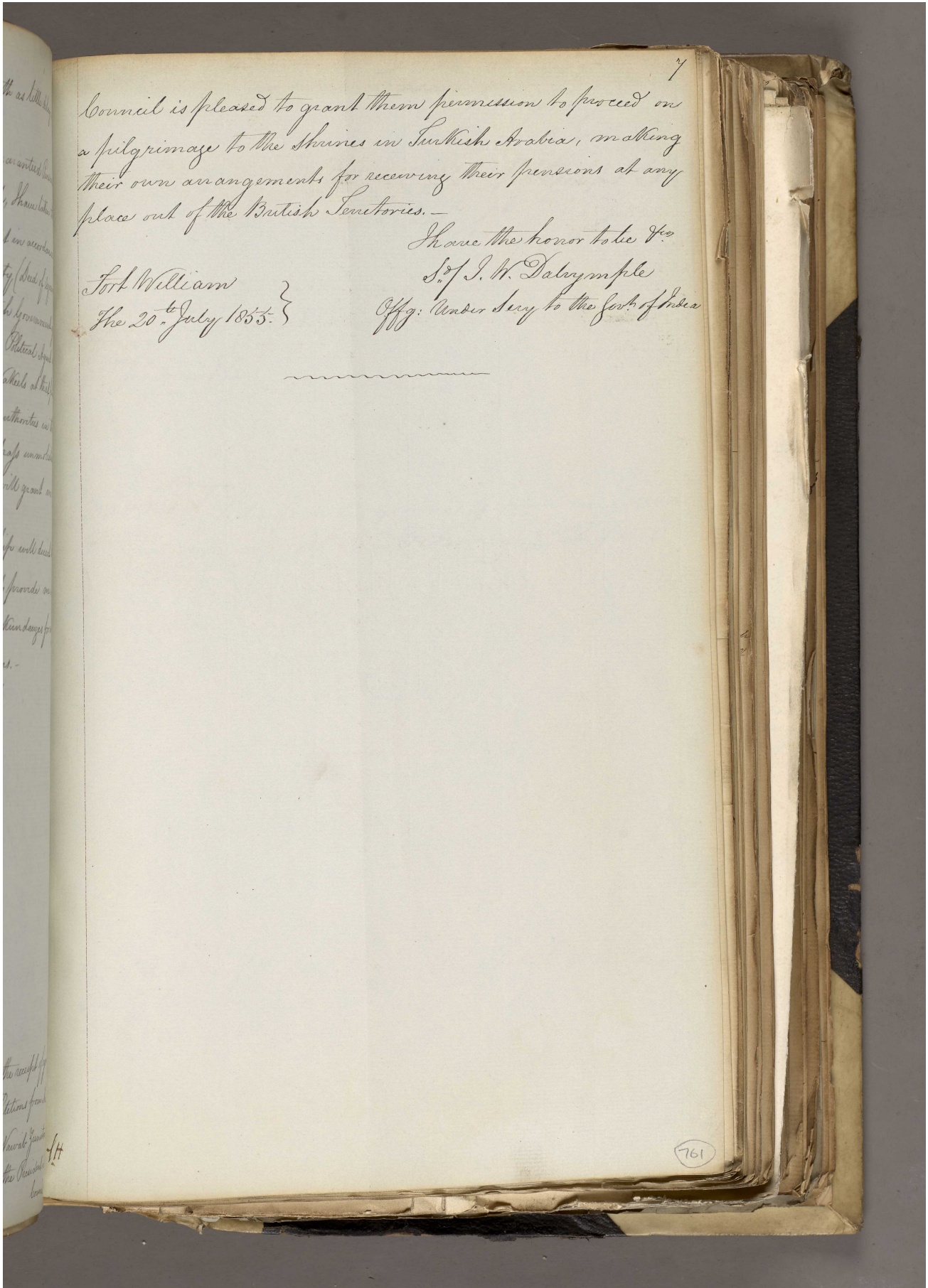
