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
About this record

A copy of a letter from Harford Jones, Resident in Bagdad [Baghdad], to John Morier, Attaché with the army of the Vizier [Yūsuf Z̄īa al-Dīn Pāshā, Grand Vizier to the Ottoman Sultan] in Egypt, sent from Bagdad and dated 10 June 1800.

The letter concerns potential assistance from the Pashaw of Bagdad [Büyük Sulaymān Pāshā, Governor of Baghdad] to the Vizier's campaign against the French occupation forces in Egypt. Jones expresses doubts about the loyalty of Timour Aga [Tīmūr Āghā], whom the Pashaw is rumoured to be sending to support the Vizier, and describes problems facing the region including plague and a Yezeedee [Yazīdī] rebellion.

The present State of this boundry is such that I do not know I could conscientionally advise the Castraw, to comply with the aguisition, that has made, to hum for a Body of Enops - A dis agreeable arrident which happened lately at Mished Ally between some Arabs of the Sect of Whater, and the Inhabitants of that place is not quite adjusted the approach of the Claque is gradually throwing things with bonfusion and if the Government, had not bun equally vigitant and dues in the discontent which people expressed in bono equence of the disas house Reports received from Egypt, would a few days ago have produced very serious Disherbances. I have had it hinted to me, that it has been proposed to the Pashaw ho send Timour aga, bejoin the Viseer, with a couple of Thousand Men, and that in such base Mutraies would confer on him the dignity of Pashaw, and the Government of Orfa. You know Ipresume that Mis person headed a most formedable Rebellion, against the Porte and that he was obliged by Newsoily, to seek Rejuge at Bagdad in the Year 1792. As it has been long in agenced, that an Idea was entertained of procuring for him the Pachalick of Orfa, I have taken some pains to, find out the Character, and disposition of the Man, His Mond is esceedingly embittined against Mr. Costs for keeping him as he towns it so long in Prison at Bagdad; and there is strong Reason, Whetheir were he at Liberty and placed in any Situation, which gave him Power his first
