بومباي، مؤرخة في ٠٩ مايو ١٨٠٣.

تتعلق الرسالة بخلاف بين مانيسيتي وعلي باشا الكهية، حاكم بغداد، نشأ في أعقاب احتجاز امرأة
مصرية تعيش مع بحار بريطاني في البصرة (انظر IOR/L/PS/9/76/299) وتحيل مراسلات ذات صلة. يقترح
مانيسيتي السفر إلى الهند، والاجتماع مع الحاكم العام للبنغال، ووضع ترتيبات جديدة للتمثيل
البريطاني في مناطق شبه الجزيرة العربية الخاضعة للحكم العثماني [الإيالات العراقية
العثمانية].

Extract from General Letter to His Most Noble the President in Council, in
the Political Department, dated the 9th May 1809.

I have also the Honor to transmit,
an open Packet to the Address of his Excellency
the Most Noble the Governor General in Council,
in the Political Department, containing very
interesting Intelligence, in different Addresses dated
the 29th and 23rd Ultimo, and 8th Instant to which I
beg leave to make a very respectful Reference.

You will necessarily lament the
Occurrence, of the surprising and unfortunate Events,
which happened in Muscat on the Night of the
4th Ultimo, and their immediate Consequences, and
you will justly appreciate, not only the present situation
of the Muscat Factory, but also the measures, which
I have adopted and mean to prosecute, in support
of its Credit, and that of the British Nation in this
Quarter of the World.

Those Measures are detailed in my
Address

Address

Address to His Excellency the Most Noble the Governor
General, in Council of the 23rd M^ohims; in the latter
part of which I have expressed the Intention, which
I entertain of proceeding, to Bengal, in order to make
personal Communications to His Excellency, in the
Event of the Nizam declining to accede to the
Demands which I have made, in Reparation of
the Injuries offered at Buxora to the British Flag,
in the person of Captain White.

The Attainment of that Reparation
is indispensably requisite. Without it, a Attempt to
reside in Buxora, would on the Part of a British
national Representative, or of British Subjects,
be ridiculous: and to relinquish the valuable
Establishment of a British Subordinate at Buxora,
without making energetic Effort to preserve it, and
to assert the Public Honor connected with it,
would be absurd and impolitic.

What are the means then to be
used, which are possible for me to adopt, most likely,
from their Nature, to obtain that Reparation?

It remains here is impossible; to
withdraw the Establishment, to Buxora and there
to remain at the Head of it, until Orders were received
from the British Government in India and Europe.

be ineffectual; to proceed to Bombay, and to submit
the Consideration of the Injuries received, and the Reparation
required to your Judgement could not lead to decisive
Arrangements, as Reference on the Subject to the Supreme
Government would be, by you, necessarily considered, as
an official Duty.


To repair therefore in Person, either
preceded or accompanied, by Captain White and his
Servants to Fort William, and there to present myself to
His Excellency the Most Noble the Governor General, for
the Purpose of making requisite Representations is certainly
an advisable Measure; by its Adoption I shall not only
be enabled, to state to His Excellency in clear, full,
circumstantial and comprehensible Detail, the
Injuries which have been sustained, at Muffora, and
to adduce, such Evidence, in Support of it, as may for
the sake of Form and the Regulations of Justice, be
required; but I shall also have an opportunity of explaining
to His Excellency, the Causes to which those Injuries and the
Rapid decline of the national Influence in this Country,
may be attributed; of suggesting to Him, the Nature of
such a British Establishment in it as could alone restore
support and extend it; and of making to His Excellency,
an offer, of proceeding from Fort William to England, in order
to make similar Communications to His Majesty's Ministers

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during my absence, as well give security to the Public
Property, and afford him the means of eligibly carrying
on the Public Correspondence between India and
Europe by this route.


I have the Honor very respectfully
to suggest, under the Probability of my early Departure
hence, the Eligibility, of your giving Directions to
all British Subjects and Commanders of Vessels
proceeding to Maspora, to put themselves under the
order of Mr. Day at Bushire, in the Event of their
finding him established there in charge of the
Affairs of the Maspora Residency.
