About this record

This item contains copies of three letters:

- 1. Part of a letter from William Bruce, Acting Resident in Bushire [Bushehr] to Jonathan Duncan, Governor of Bombay, sent from Bushire and dated 14 October 1804. Bruce reports attacks on British ships in the Persian Gulph [Gulf] by the French privateer *La Fortune* and his subsequent actions. The first part of this letter can be found in IOR/L/PS/9/76/363.
- 2. A letter from Bruce to Duncan, sent from Bushire and dated 20 October 1804. The letter describes efforts by crew members of the ship *Fly*, captured by the *La Fortune*, to recover mail seized during the attack and proceed to India.
- 3. A letter from Bruce to Duncan, sent from Bushire and dated 21 October 1804. Bruce reports that he has chartered a dow [dhow] to carry the crew of the *Fly* to India, and reports the movements of the *La Fortune*.

The Privateers Name is the La Hortune Captain Le Mome altho she has don't of there Prizes to the orde of France she still has one bourd 150 Men She is now under Weigh along with the Shrewsbury I working to the fouth intelling go to the Bar & send her Boats up the River Mobile out any befret they are able. Thave don't two copresses one by Land the other by deate inform M. Manesty who ore this has arrived for the person in charge on their quand I have every leason to Suppose that my tetters will reach them in dufficient time to prevent any Mischies taking place. I send this by an express Bout to Mushat as she did not touch there Dollowse they are ignorant of her being in this quarter thave Written to the Moker for him to inform all English takels that touch there of the Privateers being up here you there not to leave that place until they got good decounts of her having left the Gulph- Captain de Meme has made all the baptains, officers & Europeans belonging to different topsels he has taken I released Signe, a paper not to barry arms against the French Nation until regularly exchanged. as there is no likelihood of any tefsel offering from the above bircumstances to, Convey the Crew of the Hy to the Presidency Ishall if Lan procure a Dow on Teasonable terms Send them to Bombay. M. Hen shaw with the Commany of the breole was landed on the Island of khen on the 1st instant they must shortly be here that is if they come up by Land ...

Shave the Honor to be Bushire 14 October 1804 Your Most obedient Humble Servant Signed / Mm Poruce Pin Mustral .-The Honble fonathan Duncan for in Council touble dir, De Athisolly Flower was a passenger on board of the Hel when Captured by the La tottune Privateer Captain Le Meme Iwhen, Captain Manuaring had the Packet thrown, over board he took very Barticular bearings of the Shore for the purpose in Case of being landed he might endeavor to recover it. He was fortunately landed " here along with a Number of other Gentlemen out of whom Mr Howre, Captain yould M. Lounce have jointly purchased a Botella here toprocees to the Presidency & as M. Flower is pretty Confident he Can again find the Packet they have determined to Spend do me days at the place for the express purpose of dearching for it and I sincerely hope they may meet with duccels. With due dubmission Honble die allow me to Mention that Ithink M. Thowels, Lealous endeavours for the benefit of the public Service is deserving of the pavorable notice to, Government and Shope Barticularly as he has been a great Sufferer by being Captures it will plead in his behalf I that he may meel with a leward adequate to the Service he is going to undertake. Thave permetted two of the Hy's Europeans to proceed on board his Bout with him to afrist in Steering her . -Tomo wow.

The enclosed is a list of their Names and Stations. My leasons for Lending them a way from here to doon was, that in the first enstance they were agreat expence to the Company living on Shore Heing but part Europeans very hable to get into some disagneeable dispute with the Praties I which might turn out very Senously and Dolly as it was quite uncertain whether any Company's Refret would be here Shortly Ino
